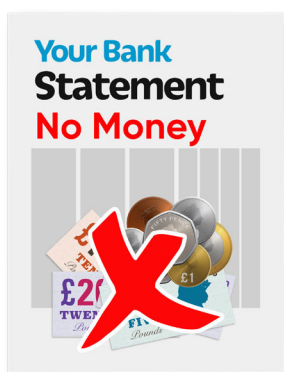
Paying for Games, Apps & Downloads

The downside to paying with a click of a button is it's hard to keep track of what you are spending because it's all done virtually and you can't see your money going down



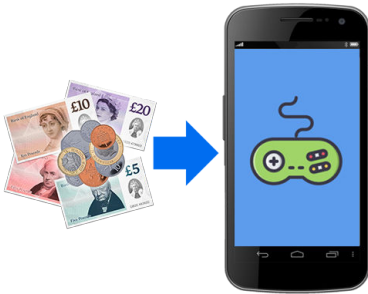
This means you could have spent more than you should and may be in debt or struggling to afford things like food and other bills
